

## Reports Due Before the May 22, 2018, Primary Runoff Election

*This notice only applies to candidates and committees that are involved in the primary runoff election*

May 14, 2018: Runoff Report **must be received** by May 14.

May 13, 2018 to May 21, 2018 at noon: Period for filing for Daily Pre-Election Reports.

**May 14, 2018: Runoff Report.** Candidates in the primary runoff election must file a runoff report due eight days before the election. This runoff report **must be received** by the Texas Ethics Commission (TEC) by May 14. All political committees that accept political contributions or make political expenditures and/or have other activity in connection with the election are also required to file this runoff report. The first day covered by the report is February 25. The last day covered by the report is May 12.

**May 13 – May 21, 2018: Daily Pre-Election Reports(s) For Contributions.** The period for filing a daily pre-election report begins on May 13 and ends at noon on May 21. A filer may be required to file more than one daily pre-election report.

- **Candidates and Specific-Purpose Committees:** A candidate or specific-purpose committee that is involved in the primary runoff election and accepts political contributions from a single source that total more than \$1,000 during the reporting period must file the daily pre-election report. A daily pre-election report **must be received** by the TEC by the first business day after the date of the contribution that causes the total amount accepted from a contributor during the period to exceed \$1,000.
- **General-Purpose Committees:** A general-purpose committee must file a daily pre-election report if the committee is involved in the primary runoff election and if the committee accepts political contributions from a person that total more than \$5,000 during the reporting period, or makes direct campaign expenditures supporting or opposing either a single candidate that total more than \$1,000 or a group of candidates that total more than \$15,000 during the reporting period. A daily pre-election report **must be received** by the TEC by the first business day after the date the contribution is accepted or the expenditure is made that causes the total amount to exceed the applicable threshold.

### Further Information

Persons filing campaign finance reports with the TEC are required to file those reports electronically unless the person falls within the statutory exemption. *Electronic reports must be filed by midnight, Central Time Zone, on the night of the filing deadline.* Please refer to “Electronic Filing” on our website for further information on electronic filing.
