Upcoming Deadlines for the September 28, 2021, Special Runoff Election for State Representative, District 10, for General-Purpose Committees and County Executive Committees

This notice is to remind you of upcoming deadlines *that may apply to you* **if** your general-purpose political committee (GPAC) or county executive committee (CEC) is involved in the September 28, 2021, Special Runoff Election for State Representative, District 10. All reports listed below are required to be filed with the Texas Ethics Commission (TEC) if the committee accepted political contributions or made political expenditures and/or had other activity in connection with this election. If your committee is not involved in this special runoff election, these reports are not required.

SEPTEMBER 20, 2021: Runoff Report: A runoff report due eight days before this special runoff election must be ***received by*** the TEC by Monday, September 20, 2021, if the committee has activity in connection with the September 28, 2021, special runoff election during the period covered by the runoff report. The first day covered by the report is July 1, 2021, or the date your campaign treasurer appointment was filed, or the day after the date your last report ended, as applicable. The last day covered by the report is September 18, 2021.

SEPTEMBER 19 – SEPTEMBER 27, 2021: Daily Pre-Election Report(s): The reporting period for filing daily pre-election reports begins on September 19, 2021, and ends at noon on September 27, 2021. A campaign treasurer of a GPAC or CEC must file one or more daily pre-election reports if the committee is involved in this special runoff election, and if the committee accepts political contributions from a single source that total more than \$6,370 during the reporting period, or makes direct campaign expenditures supporting or opposing either a single candidate that total more than \$1,860 or a group of candidates that total more than \$27,950 during the reporting period. A daily pre-election report must be ***received by*** the TEC not later than the first business day after the date the contribution is accepted or the expenditure is made that causes the total amount to exceed the applicable threshold. Therefore, you may be required to file more than one daily pre-election report. Any political activity reported on a daily pre-election report must be reported again on the next required campaign finance report.

ELECTRONIC FILING: Campaign finance reports must be filed electronically unless you qualify for the statutory exemption. To be in compliance with current requirements, you must use the campaign finance filing application found at www.ethics.state.tx.us/filinginfo/TECindex.php. If you are a GPAC, select "Political Committees" from the left hand menu. If you are a CEC, select "Political Parties" from the left hand menu. **If this is your first time filing with the application**, we suggest you view the instructional videos also available at that link. When you file electronically, if you have successfully filed your report, you will see your report listed in your "Filed Reports" grid under "Manage My Reports" in the filing application. A confirmation number will also be sent to your email. ***If your report is listed in your "In-Progress Reports" grid, your report is NOT FILED.*** Remember, you can file a report as soon as the reporting period ends, and we encourage you to file as early as possible so that if you experience any problems, we can assist you.

TIMELY FILING: A campaign finance report transmitted by Internet is considered timely filed if it is successfully transmitted in the correct format by midnight, Central Time Zone, on the date of the filing deadline. A campaign finance report eligible to be filed on paper, by a person who qualifies for the electronic filing exemption, **must be received by the TEC by 5:00 p.m. on the filing deadline.** All paper reports must include the electronic filing exemption form, which may be found at www.ethics.state.tx.us/data/forms/affd/elf_pac_aff.pdf.

LATE-FILING PENALTY: The minimum civil penalty for filing a late runoff report is \$500. The minimum civil penalty for filing a late daily pre-election report is \$500 for each report that is late.
