

**Reports Due before the January 28, 2020, Special Runoff Elections for  
State Representative, House District 28, or  
State Representative, House District 100, or  
State Representative, House District 148**

*This notice only applies to candidates and committees that are involved in these special runoff elections*

January 21, 2020 (deadline extended due to holiday): Runoff report must be received by January 21.

January 19, 2020, to January 27, 2020, at noon: Filing period for daily pre-election reports.

January 23, 2020: Personal Financial Statement due.

**January 21, 2019 (deadline is extended due to holiday):** The runoff report due 8 days before these special runoff elections ***must be received*** by the Texas Ethics Commission by January 21. Candidates for these offices must file this runoff report *even if there was no activity* during the reporting period. Political committees that accept political contributions or make political expenditures and/or have other activity in connection with these elections are also required to file this report. The first day covered by the report is January 1, 2020, the date your campaign treasurer appointment was filed, or the day after the date the last report ended, as applicable. The last day covered by the report is January 18, 2020.

**January 19 – January 27, 2020:** The period for filing daily pre-election reports begins January 19, 2020, and ends at noon on January 27, 2020. A filer may be required to file more than one daily pre-election report.

- **Candidates and Specific-Purpose Committees:** A candidate or specific-purpose committee that accepts political contributions from a single source that total more than \$1,790 during the reporting period must file the daily pre-election report. A daily pre-election report ***must be received*** by the Texas Ethics Commission by the first business day after the date of the contribution that causes the total amount accepted from a contributor during the period to exceed \$1,790.
- **General-Purpose Committees:** A general-purpose committee must file a daily pre-election report if the committee is involved in this special runoff election, and if the committee accepts political contributions from a person that total more than \$6,090 during the reporting period, or makes direct campaign expenditures supporting or opposing either a single candidate that total more than \$1,790 or a group of candidates that total more than \$26,780 during the reporting period. A daily pre-election report ***must be received*** by the first business day after the date the contribution is accepted or the expenditure is made that causes the total amount to exceed the applicable threshold.

**January 23, 2020:** The PFS must be filed no later than midnight Central Time Zone on January 23, 2020. This statement must cover financial activity for the calendar year ending December 31, 2019. It is required to be filed by all candidates on these special election ballots. The PFS must be filed electronically. An extension of this filing deadline is not available.

### **Further Information**

Persons filing campaign finance reports with the Texas Ethics Commission are required to file those reports electronically unless the person falls within the statutory exemption. *Electronic reports must be filed by midnight, Central Time Zone, on the night of the filing deadline.* Please refer to "File Reports Electronically" on our website for further information on electronic filing.
