Reports Due Before the November 7, 2023, Special Election for House District 2

This notice only applies to candidates and committees that are involved in this special election

October 10, 2023: 30-day campaign finance report must be received by October 10.

October 30, 2023: 8-day campaign finance report must be received by October 30.

October 29, 2023, to November 6, 2023, at noon: period for filing daily pre-election reports.

October 10, 2023 (deadline extended due to weekend and holiday): The 30-day pre-election campaign finance report <u>must be received</u> by the Texas Ethics Commission by October 10, 2023. Candidates for the office must file even if there was no activity during the reporting period. Political committees that accept political contributions or make political expenditures and/or have other activity in connection with this election are also required to file this report. The first day covered by the report is July 1, 2023, or the date your campaign treasurer appointment was filed, or the day after the date the last report ended, as applicable. The last day covered by the report is September 28, 2023.

October 30, 2023: The 8-day pre-election campaign finance report <u>must be received</u> by the Texas Ethics Commission by October 30, 2023. Candidates for the office must file <u>even if there was no activity</u> during the reporting period. Political committees that accept political contributions or make political expenditures and/or have other activity in connection with this election are also required to file this report. The first day covered by the report is September 29, 2023, or the date your campaign treasurer appointment was filed, or the day after the date the last report ended, as applicable. The last day covered by the report is October 28, 2023.

October 29, 2023 – November 6, 2023: The period for filing a daily pre-election report begins on October 29, 2023, and ends at noon on November 6, 2023. A filer may be required to file more than one daily pre-election report.

- Candidates and Specific-Purpose Committees: A candidate or specific-purpose committee that accepts political contributions from a single source that total more than \$2,020 during the reporting period must file a daily pre-election report. A daily pre-election report <u>must be received</u> by the Ethics Commission by the first business day after the date of the contribution that causes the total amount accepted from a contributor during the period to exceed \$2,020.
- General-Purpose Committees: A campaign treasurer of a GPAC or CEC must file a daily pre-election report if the committee is involved in this special election and if the committee accepts political contributions from a person that total more than \$6,910 during the reporting period, or makes direct campaign expenditures supporting or opposing either a single candidate that total more than \$2,020 or a group of candidates that total more than \$30,330 during the reporting period. A daily pre-election report <u>must be received</u> by the Ethics Commission by the first business day after the date the contribution is accepted or the expenditure is made that causes the total amount to exceed the applicable threshold.

Further Information

Persons filing campaign finance reports with the Ethics Commission are required to file those reports electronically unless the person falls within the statutory exemption. *Electronic reports must be filed by midnight, Central Time Zone, on the night of the filing deadline*.
