

REVISED NOTICE of 5/15/26

(Revised to clarify the reporting period for daily reports)

Reports Due Before the May 26, 2026, Primary Runoff Election

This notice only applies to candidates and committees that are involved in the primary runoff election

May 18, 2026: Runoff Report **must be received** by May 18.

May 17, 2026 to May 25, 2026 at noon: Reporting period for filing Daily Pre-Election Reports (activity taking place on May 25 must be reported in the daily report due May 26).

May 18, 2026: Runoff Report. Candidates in the primary runoff election must file a runoff report due eight days before the election. This runoff report **must be received** by the Texas Ethics Commission (TEC) by May 18. All political committees that accept political contributions or make political expenditures and/or have other activity in connection with the election are also required to file this runoff report. The first day covered by the report is February 22. The last day covered by the report is May 16.

May 17 – May 25, 2026: Daily Pre-Election Report(s). The period covering daily pre-election reports for contributions and direct campaign expenditures begins on May 17 and ends at noon on May 25. Reports covering May 22 through May 25 are due no later than midnight on May 26 (or 5:00 p.m. on May 26 for those reports not filed electronically), deadline extended due to weekend and holiday. A filer may be required to file more than one daily pre-election report.

- **Candidates and Specific-Purpose Committees:** A candidate or specific-purpose committee that is involved in the primary runoff election and accepts political contributions from a single source that total more than \$2,290 during the reporting period must file the daily pre-election report. A daily pre-election report **must be received** by the TEC by the first business day after the date of the contribution that causes the total amount accepted from a contributor during the period to exceed \$2,290.
- **General-Purpose Committees:** A general-purpose committee must file a daily pre-election report if the committee is involved in the primary runoff election and if the committee accepts political contributions from a person that total more than \$7,820 during the reporting period, or makes direct campaign expenditures supporting or opposing either a single candidate that total more than \$2,290 or a group of candidates that total more than \$34,330 during the reporting period. A daily pre-election report **must be received** by the TEC by the first business day after the date the contribution is accepted or the expenditure is made that causes the total amount to exceed the applicable threshold.

Further Information

Persons filing campaign finance reports with the TEC are required to file those reports electronically unless the person falls within the statutory exemption. *Electronic reports must be filed by midnight, Central Time Zone, on the night of the filing deadline.* Please refer to “Filing A Report” on our website for further information on electronic filing.
